UK AFFILIATE NEWS

Katia Mace, a FIGT conference alum, is currently leading a study exploring belonging and cultural identity amongst individuals who experienced several international relocations during childhood. They are trying to find out whether having a mobile childhood leads people to struggle with questions such as 'where do I belong?' and whether things such as the number of passports you have, the number of languages you speak and the number of times you moved have any bearing on this.

They are looking for participants who have:

a) experienced at least two international relocations before the age
